## 5 Ways to... Fab Hair in 5 Minutes

### 1 TOP KNOT

A go-to for many celebrities, the messy top-knot is an effortlessly chic way to look put together. Pull hair into a high pony at the top of your head, then, flattening the pony against your head, wrap it around the band; pin into place. Thin hair? Try a sock bun: Cut the toe part off a clean, old sock. Gather hair into a high pony, then pull the pony through the sock hole. Roll hair outwards, tucking it around the circumference of the sock, then keep rolling down until the hair-

### 3 FANCY FISHTAIL

This fancy look is surprisingly easy to do. Divide hair into two equal sections to one side of your head. Take a thin strand from the outside of the first section, cross it over and add it to the second section, and pull it tightly. ### 2 ROLLED BUN

For an ultra feminine look, opt for a rolled side bun. Tie hair into a low side ponytail, then take the end of the ponytail and roll it up inwards, stopping behind the ear. Pin the roll into place, then adorn with a jewelled clip.

### 4 PUFFED PONY

Even your favourite pony can be spruced up with minimal effort. Pulling up the top layer of your hair, tease at the crown. Gently smooth the top layer of hair back, then pin at the crown using bobby pins. Pull the rest of your hair into a ponytail right under the crown, being careful not to flatten the volume.

### 5 TOUSLED TWIST

This simple 'do created by Celebrity Stylist, Head & Shoulders Ambassador Peter Lux, is ideal for wavy hair. Spritz on a light texturing spray then, using your fingers, section hair into a side or centre parting. "It's ok if the parting is random, as this is a romantic look," Peter says. Take two sections from the front and twist in a backwards motion, leading the sections towards the back of your head. Secure with a few pins, and spritz with a light mist of hairspray. Voila! ■
